Reconstructed based on historic maps and more than 50 years of archaeological excavations that continue today, Colonial Michilimackinac offers a one-of-a-kind experience from cannon and musket firings to hearth cooking and crafts.



Located on the shore of the Straits of Mackinac, Colonial Michilimackinac offers visitors stunning views of the Mackinac Bridge, the straits, and the Upper Peninsula from its palisade walls. They can also enjoy a shoreline picnic near Kids' Rendezvous playground or buy unique gifts, books and apparel from the expansive museum store.



Join French voyageurs and Native Americans as they demonstrate their way of life. The past and present blur into a fascinating and unmatched experience at Colonial Michilimackinac.



At Colonial Michilimackinac, life continues like it did in the 1700s. Watch smoke billow from cannons and muskets fired by British soldiers and help colonial women prepare food and tend the garden.
