Colonial Michilimackinac Opening Delayed on Labor Day

MACKINAW CITY — In an effort to cooperate with safety measures being implemented by the Michigan State Police for the 2019 Labor Day Bridge Walk across the Mackinac Bridge, the Colonial Michilimackinac Visitor's Center parking lot, located under the bridge, will be closed until 12:00 p.m. on Labor Day, September 2.

Consequently, Colonial Michilimackinac, an 18th-century British fort and fur trading village, will open at 12:00 p.m. on Labor Day. Scheduled programs will start for the day at that time, and the site will close at 5:00 p.m., with last admission at 4:00 p.m.

Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse, located just east of Colonial Michilimackinac and the Mackinac Bridge, and Historic Mill Creek Discovery Park, located three miles east of Mackinaw City on US 23, will open at 9:00 a.m. Fort Mackinac and The Richard and Jane Manoogian Mackinac Art Museum on Mackinac Island will be open as normal.
