War in the West: Michilimackinac 1779. Treasures from the past come to life at this 18th-century fort and fur trading village, reconstructed based on historic maps and more than 60 years of archaeological excavations. As you walk through the site, you are stepping back in time to 1779, as war headed west during the American Revolution. Historical interpreters representing voyageurs, British soldiers, and French-Canadian merchant families are stationed throughout the fort to answer your questions and perform demonstrations.



Open May 5–October 9, 2022

Made to be seen. A point in the storm and guiding beacon since 1889, Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse helped passing ships navigate through the treacherous waters of the Straits of Mackinac. Authentically restored quarters and exhibits, including the original lens and an exhibit dedicated to science and technology, a film, *Shipwrecks of the Straits*, the Straits of Mackinac Shipwreck Museum, and an exploration of the original keeper's family on the second floor of the house make this “Castle of the Straits” a true gem of the Great Lakes.



Open May 6–September 4, 2022

Have an adventure. Discover the past. Discover nature. Discover it all at Historic Mill Creek Discovery Park, where visitors can witness the power of the creek harnessed to cut timber into lumber at one of the oldest industrial sites on the upper Great Lakes. Additionally, soar like eagles on the Eagle's Flight Zip Line, trek through the treetops on the Forest Canopy Bridge and climb the layers of the forest on the Treetop Discovery Tower on the Adventure Tour. Special safety restrictions apply to the Adventure Tour.

Iconic. The cannon blasts, the rifles fire, the soldiers march and history comes alive. The oldest public building in Michigan and 13 other historical structures boast exhibits explaining everything from military training and battles, to medical treatments, to family life within the fort. Regular demonstrations and tours by costumed interpreters are scheduled throughout the day, along with special programs highlighting different aspects of the fort's history.

A time of change. Step into the home of Agatha and Edward Biddle, merchants who moved in around 1830. This was a time of change, and the 1830s were critical to the Biddles for another reason: as an Anishnaabek woman, Agatha and other indigenous people witnessed their culture subject to immense change. The decade transformed the Anishnaabek, linking old ways with Michigan's modern indigenous cultures.
