Michilimackinac 1780: Mischief and Mayhem. Treasures from the past come to life at this 18th-century fort and fur trading village, reconstructed based on historic maps and more than 60 years of archaeological excavations. As you walk through the site, you are stepping back in time to 1780, where this isolated British outpost was the scene of paranoia, personal feuds, military mischief, and, from a certain point of view, mutiny. Historical interpreters are stationed throughout the site to answer questions and provide demonstrations.

Mackinaw City



Open May 11–October 8, 2023

Made to be seen. A point in the storm and guiding beacon since 1889, Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse helped passing ships navigate through the treacherous waters of the Straits of Mackinac. Authentically restored quarters and exhibits, including the original Fresnel lens and an exhibit dedicated to science and technology, a film, Shipwrecks of the Straits, the Straits of Mackinac Shipwreck Museum, and an exploration of the original keeper's family on the second floor of the house make this "Castle of the Straits" a true gem of the Great Lakes.



Open May 12–September 3, 2023

Have an adventure. Discover the past. Discover nature. Explore one of the oldest industrial sites on the Upper Great Lakes. Smell the sawdust as sawyers demonstrate the pit saw method of cutting lumber, then feel the power of the creek used to cut timber inside the reconstructed sawmill. Then, soar like an eagle on the Eagle's Flight Zip Line, trek through the treetops on the Forest Canopy Bridge and climb the layers of the forest on the Treetop Discovery Tower on the Forest Adventure Experience, a special trek through the North Woods.

Iconic. The cannon blasts, the rifles fire, the soldiers march and history comes alive. The oldest public building in Michigan and 13 other historical structures boast exhibits explaining everything from military training and battles, to medical treatments, to family life within the fort. Regular demonstrations and tours by costumed interpreters are scheduled throughout the day, along with special programs highlighting different aspects of the fort's history.

A time of change. Step into the home of Agatha and Edward Biddle, merchants who moved in around 1830. This was a time of change, and the 1830s were critical to the Biddles for another reason: as an Anishnaabek woman, Agatha and other indigenous people witnessed their culture subject to immense change. The decade transformed the Anishnaabek, linking old ways with Michigan's modern indigenous cultures.
