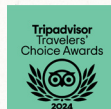

7-DAY ALL ACCESS FAMILY PASS: Admission to all Mackinac State Historic Parks sites for seven days - \$90

DINE ABOVE IT ALL: The Tea Room, operated by Grand Hotel, has been a memorable part of a visit to Fort Mackinac for decades. Open all day serving snacks, beverages, and desserts. Lunches are served from 11:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Admission required.

The Fort Mackinac Museum Store, located within the Post Commissary, offers a variety of apparel, unique mementos, gifts and publications. Admission required.

Fort Mackinac is mostly accessible - alternate programs have been provided for areas with difficult access. A Guide to Access is available at both admissions counters. Well-behaved pets welcome. There is no smoking on site.

Located on the bluff above Marquette Park on Mackinac Island.

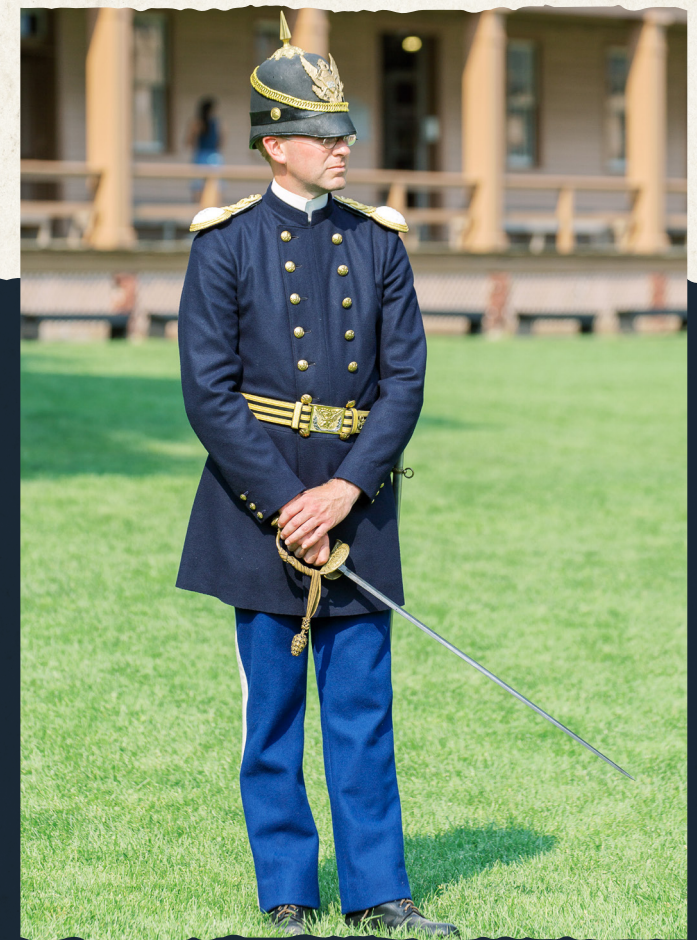

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THE HIGHLIGHT OF ANY VISIT TO MACKINAC ISLAND

The cannon blasts. The rifles fire. The soldiers march. History comes alive. The oldest public building in Michigan and 13 other historic structures boast exhibits explaining everything from military training and battles, to medical treatments, to family life within the fort. Regular demonstrations and tours by costumed interpreters are scheduled throughout the day, with special programs for both adults and kids highlighting different aspects of the fort's history. More than just a military outpost, Fort Mackinac

served as a home for soldiers and their families and eventually the headquarters for Mackinac National Park, where tourists to the island visited the great fortress on the bluff, much as they do today. All fourteen buildings in the fort are restored and open to the public. One of the more unforgettable aspects of a visit to Fort Mackinac is lunch at the Tea Room, operated by Grand Hotel, offering unparalleled views of Mackinac Island's downtown, the Straits of Mackinac, and the Mackinac Bridge.



The Fort Mackinac Museum Store is located in the 1878 Post Commissary and features Mackinac State Historic Parks publications, clothing and merchandise, and one-of-a-kind collectibles and souvenirs.

Your Fort Mackinac ticket also includes free admission to The Richard & Jane Manoogian Mackinac Art Museum, Biddle House, featuring the Mackinac Island Native American Museum, Benjamin Blacksmith Shop, American Fur Co. Store & Dr. Beaumont Museum, and McGulpin House. Dates of operation vary by site.
